It is vitally important that your reason for training with us is to get a job and that you are prepared to do what it takes to get that job!

Throughout this programme, you will be shown the skills needed to find employment successfully. This support is continued following the programme, with help finding employment or the appropriate next education programme to further your career.

As a part of your training, you will be placed into the industry for work experience. Many job seekers gain employment from this work experience.

You finish Work Start when you gain employment (a maximum of 26 weeks training).

What you could achieve

The Academy assists every job seeker to set learning goals and plan steps to gain employment. When in employment support is given to ensure the transition to earning and independence is smooth.

All unit standard based learning gained from this programme is recorded with the New Zealand Qualifications Authority. These achievements remain with you forever and can be added to at any time.

WORKstart Community Care includes:

- Health & Safety
- Basic anatomy and physiology; and first aid
- Client care - which involves providing a safe environment, food hygiene, cleanliness and learning how to lift and position people safely
- Support for the client by being aware of their culture, physical and emotional needs, daily living activities and knowing their rights and responsibilities
- Community awareness including knowledge of support services and resource.

We'll do more than teach you basic care giving and lifting skills - we'll also sit down with you to determine the skills and attitudes you need to get working!

The WORKstart Community Care programme offers a broad base of skills to enable you to care for the elderly or people with disabilities effectively with compassion.

It is ideal for people wishing to learn the introductory skills needed to enter into this profession.
