The Certificate in Floristry Level 4 programme is designed for experienced junior to intermediate-level florists with at least a year's industry practice. The course builds on the Academy New Zealand's Level 3 Certificate in Floristry enabling graduates to achieve the National Certificate in Floristry Level 4. Advanced floristry skills using a range of base media and innovative design techniques are taught during this programme. Students will develop a portfolio of evidence to showcase their achievements during the course.

Programme detail.

This intensive programme includes the following:

- **Design skills:** Creating floristry designs using various base media such as floral foam, chicken wire, clay, willow vine etc.
- **Industry guests:** Regular guest presenters on a variety of cutting edge design techniques.
- **Customer service:** Skills to work with client and meet their needs.
- **Detection skills:** Knowledge of the pest and diseases that can affect floriculture.
- **Supplementary craft skills.**
- **Competition:** Opportunity to take part in a competition within the course with guest judges.
- **Business skills.**
- **Working in a team.**

Quality points.

Small classes facilitated by Tutors who are experienced florists. Specialist guest presenters. Practical tuition using demonstrations and the chance to apply these skills. Dedicated floristry workshop with access to a wide range of equipment, materials, flowers and foliage.

Certification.

Leading to the Academy Certificate in Floristry Level 4 and to unit standards that complete the National Certificate in Floristry Level 4 for students who already hold the Academy Certificate in Floristry Level 3, or equivalent.

Entry criteria.

Academy New Zealand Level 3 Floristry qualification or the equivalent qualification from a New Zealand Polytechnic or Institute of Technology.

International qualifications or extensive industry experience may be considered at the Manager's discretion.

Duration.

15 weeks full time.

Programme start date.
